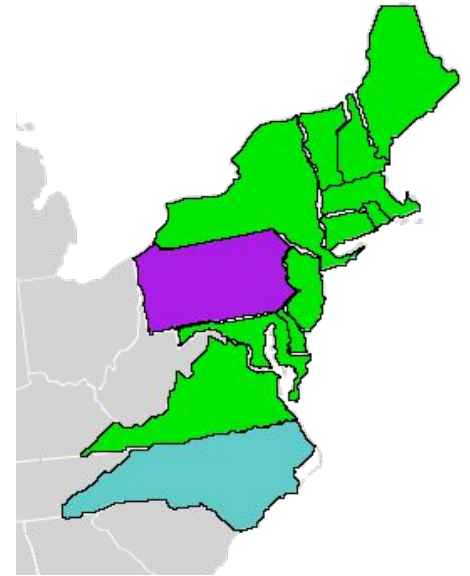


PENNSYLVANIA ENTERS THE REGIONAL GREENHOUSE GAS INITIATIVE (RGGI)

PA joined 11 other states in RGGI; a proven, market based approach to emissions reduction. Fossil fuel-fired power plants pay for the CO₂ they emit, thus incentivizing them to reduce their emissions & encouraging renewable energy. The proceeds from RGGI will be used to benefit consumers & reduce greenhouse gas emissions.
